¹LORD, you have searched me,

- so you know all about me.
- ² You know when I sit down and when I get up. You know my thoughts from far away.
- ³ You know where I go and where I lie down. You know everything I do.
- ⁴ LORD, you know what I want to say, even before the words leave my mouth.
- ⁵ You are all around me—in front of me and behind me, and have laid Your hand on me.
- ⁶ I am amazed at what you know; it is too much for me to understand.

or go to live in the west beyond the sea,

- ¹⁰ even there you will take my hand and lead me.
 - Your strong right hand will protect me.

¹¹ Suppose I wanted to hide from you and said, "Surely the darkness will hide me. The day will change to night and cover me."
¹² Even the darkness is not dark to you. The night is as bright as the day. Darkness and light are the same.

¹⁶ You could see my body grow each passing day.^[c]

You listed all my parts, and not one of them was missing.

¹⁷ Your thoughts are beyond my understanding.^[d]

They cannot be measured!

¹⁸ If I could count them, they would be more than all the grains of sand.

But when I finished, I would have just begun.
